

YOUTH VOLUNTEER POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

GOAL: To safely involve community youth volunteers in programs, which help eliminate hunger.

Youth (ages 8-17) who wish to volunteer with Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB) are required to have written parental permission. The SHFB Volunteer Services Manager must also pre-approve all youth volunteers and their duties and is responsible for this policy.

PROGRAMS FOR YOUTH:

Ages 8-13: May volunteer for Community Food Sorts (currently on the second and fourth Saturday of each month.)

Ages 14-17: May volunteer for SHFB in the office and/or for warehouse duties.

PARENTAL APPROVAL: Youth are required to have written prior consent from parent and/or guardian, in order to volunteer with SHFB. The *Youth Volunteer Consent Form* is located on the back of side of this sheet.

CHAPERONE/SUPERVISION RATIO: The ratio of Chaperones/Supervisors for youth volunteers ages 8-10 it is 1-on-1, and for youth volunteers ages 11-13 it is 1 adult for every 3 youth. For youth volunteers 14 & up no adult supervision is required.

GROUP CHAPERONES/SUPERVISORS RESPONSIBILITIES: Chaperones/supervisors are responsible for keeping youth volunteers on task and for helping to maintain appropriate behavior. The SHFB Volunteer Services Manager may place restrictions on group size.

NOTIFICATIONS: Volunteers should call (831-722-7110 ext. 205) as soon as possible if unable to arrive as scheduled and to let the Volunteer Services Manager know as soon as they arrive on the premises.

ORIENTATION AND TRAINING: Will be provided for all youth volunteers. A general orientation to SHFB training specific to your position will be provided by the supervisor of the volunteer position.

- SAFETY: Youth volunteers may not operate or work around the following equipment:
 - Forklifts, compactors and/or balers.
 - Vehicles: may not operate, load and/or unload fleet trucks and/or forklifts; may not transport other SHFB volunteers in any vehicle.
 - Any other equipment, not listed here, but prohibited by law, statute or local ordinance.

ACCIDENTS: If an accident does occur, report <u>ALL</u> the <u>INFORMATION</u> to your supervisor IMMEDIATELY!

Second Harvest Food Bank Santa Cruz County requires permission for anyone under the age of 18 to participate in any volunteer activity. All volunteers must be 14 years of age or older to independently volunteer on-site during our Monday-Saturday shifts (only when volunteering on site at the food bank); this will be at the discretion of the Volunteer Services Manager. A parent or guardian who is over the age of 21 must accompany youth ages 8-13 while volunteering at the food bank (this will only be allowed during our Saturday sorts).

All volunteers will be required to follow our volunteer agreement, as well as the directives of the Volunteer Services Manager and other staff members. All youth volunteers are required to have a current Parent/Guardian form on file at Second Harvest Food Bank in order to volunteer.

VOLUNTEER AGREEMENT

Second Harvest Food Bank appreciates your services, and we will do our utmost to ensure that your volunteer experience is rewarding, productive, and safe. We are committed to respecting your skills and individual needs within the limitations of these requirements. We ask your cooperation in abiding by these guidelines.

- Complete duties as assigned; <u>ask for help or directions</u> as needed. Report possible hazards or unsafe activities you see.
- Anyone under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol will not be permitted to volunteer.
- <u>Wash hands</u> before handling food, after break, smoking, or returning from the restroom. Observe good housekeeping practices when working, by keeping the work area <u>clean and orderly.</u>
- Use <u>proper lifting techniques</u>: when lifting heavy objects, use your legs to push upwards, keeping your back straight and your body balanced. If you need help, <u>do not hesitate</u> to ask a supervisor for assistance.
- Only food bank staff members may operate forklifts. Volunteers must be trained before operating any equipment. Volunteers under 18 years-old may not work around forklifts, pallet jacks, or participate in the loading or unloading of vehicles, while power equipment is present, or the operation of fleet vehicles.
- Wear sensible clothing, <u>solid closed-toed shoes and long pants</u>. Sandals, tank tops, shorts, offensive clothing, and walk-mans/lpods are not permitted.
- Running, <u>horseplay</u> (throwing fruit, etc.), riding pallet jacks, and walking or stepping on pallets is <u>not</u> permitted.
- Food or any product may not be taken from the warehouse or food sorting areas unless under Partners In Need Program supervision. <u>Unauthorized possession will be considered stealing</u>.
- <u>Sexual harassment</u>, violence, harassing behavior or offensive speech will not be tolerated by staff or volunteers. Report incidents immediately to staff members.
- Please use discretion when conducting personal business during your volunteer time.
- All volunteers must advise staff or supervisor if leaving the premises before the end of a scheduled shift.
- Youths ages 8-13 must be in an organized volunteer group and/or supervised by a responsible adult at all times. Youth volunteers in this age group may only volunteer at Saturday sorts
- Youths ages 14 & over are allowed to volunteer from Monday-Saturday, at the discretion of the Volunteer Services Manager.

I have read the volunteer agreement and acknowledge my responsibility to follow these rules while I am a volunteer for any sponsored Second Harvest Food Bank activity. Any injuries will be reported immediately to a volunteer supervisor or staff member. I understand that I will be asked to discontinue volunteering if I do not follow these requirements and show good judgment.
