Cultivating Change: Food Bank Launches Land & Sea Sustainability Efforts

Program nourishes community and economy, features produce from BIPOC farmers, and local fisheries.

WATSONVILLE, CA January 17, 2024 - Second Harvest Food Bank Santa Cruz County launches its innovative "Land & Sea" initiative prioritizing locally sourced, sustainable, produce and meat proteins. The Land aspect of this effort, the Farmer Equity Program (FEP), supports BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color)-owned farms across Santa Cruz, San Benito, and Monterey Counties, while the Sea aspect supports the local fishing economy by sourcing nutritious seafood from Monterey Bay. This groundbreaking program aims to alleviate immediate food insecurity issues, lower food-miles, and circulate money in the local economy. These initiatives also seek to strengthen community ties, endorse organic sustainability practices, and enhance the overall well-being of the local region and its residents.

A significant forward stride in the realm of food sourcing, these initiatives showcase The Food Bank's commitment to supporting local and BIPOC organic farmers and local fisheries, while addressing broader community needs.
