## The Food Bank Celebrates Fund Raisers and Community Hunger Fighters

Second Harvest Food Bank celebrates local individuals and organizations

for impactful community efforts.

**SANTA CRUZ, CA March 8, 2024 -** Despite March's unpredictable weather, Second Harvest Food Bank powered through to unveil the remarkable results of their largest annual fundraising event. The much-anticipated Holiday Food & Fund Drive Awards Dinner, chaired by Susan True, Community Foundation Santa Cruz County CEO and Dr. Faris Sabbah Santa Cruz County Superintendent of Schools, was a sold-out affair, buzzing with excitement as the community's team spirit and generosity was celebrated.

From November 3, 2023, to January 15, 2024, the community rallied together and raised the equivalent of an astonishing 4,695,069 healthy meals. Every dollar raised during this event went directly toward feeding food-insecure residents of Santa Cruz County, making a tangible impact on the lives of many.

At this highly anticipated annual event, the spotlight shone on Richard Crowe of St. Francis Catholic Kitchen and Ray Mosier of LiUNA Local 270, who were honored as Second Harvest Food Bank's Hunger Fighters of the Year. Richard Crowe, with his unwavering dedication as Program Director for over two decades, ensures that 26,000 meals are served annually, providing

heartwarming spirit. Their commitment and compassion were recognized with awards and proclamations from numerous esteemed government municipalities, representatives, and officials.

Not to be overshadowed, local businesses and organizations were also praised for their pivotal roles in this successful fundraiser. Central Coast Alliance for Health, Twin Lakes Church, UC Santa Cruz, Freedom Rotary, and Community Foundation of Santa Cruz County, Santa Cruz Warriors, Driscoll's, Dominican Hospital, and Park Avenue Fitness, among others, were commended for their significant contributions.

The Food Bank acknowledges that while these larger contributions make a substantial impact, the collective effort of numerous smaller organizations and individuals was equally vital to the fundraiser's success. This united effort truly exemplifies the spirit of community and compassion that defines Santa Cruz County.
